

Research Task Education Superhero Profile: Malala Yousafzai

- 1. Where did Malala grow up? Swat Valley, Pakistan.
- 2. Where did Malala's father work when she was little? Malala's father ran a school for girls and boys. He also worked as a teacher before he founded the school in the Swat Valley.
- 3. Where was Malala when she was shot? Malala was travelling home on the school bus when she was shot in the head.
- 4. How old was Malala when she was shot? Malala was 15 years old when she was shot.
- 5. Why was Malala attacked? Malala was attacked because the Taliban had taken over the part of Pakistan she was living in and they did not believe in education for girls. Malala had given a speech titled "How Dare the Taliban Take Away My Basic Right to Education". The speech was publicised throughout Pakistan and she even appeared on television. In 2011 Malala was nominated for the International Children's Peace Prize. Her views became well known and were supported by people in Pakistan and around the world, all this angered the Taliban.
- 6. Where was Malala taken to recover after being shot? Malala was taken to Birmingham, England for surgery where she recovered and stayed with her family.



- 7. What are two great things Malala has achieved since leaving hospital? Since recovering from the attack and subsequent surgery, Malala has won the United Nations Human Rights Prize, has been names on of Time magazine's most influential people, has co authored several books and won the 2014 Nobel Peace Prize. She has also graduated from University of Oxford and opened a girls' school for refugees in Lebanon.
- 8. What does Malala think about education for girls? Malala believes all children have a right to an education, no matter their age or gender.
