## DISABILITY ACCESS PLAN THE POTTER'S HOUSE CHRISTIAN CENTRE LEVEL 1, 519 HIGH STREET, PENRITH

# DISABILITY ACCESS PLAN THE POTTER'S HOUSE CHRISTIAN CENTRE LEVEL 1, 519 HIGH STREET, PENRITH

#### 1. BACKGROUND

The Potter's House Christian Centre is a Church with presently a small number of members who meet at premises at Level 1, 519 high Street, Penrith. The number of members who meet there regularly is less than 20.

The premises main entry is from High Street, from which a flight of stairs leads to Level 1. The stairs are of 300mm going x 180mm riser. From High Street, there is a flight of 14 risers, then a landing of 1070mm length, followed by another flight of 10 risers. The stairs are of 1340mm width, with handrails both sides. At Level 1 there is a foyer area of dimensions approximately 3000mm x 4150mm, from which a swing door of width 1200mm leads to the Potter's House meeting room.

The Potter's House holds development consent from Penrith City Council for use of the premises.

#### 2. DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION ACT

The Disability Discrimination Act 1991 (DDA) makes it unlawful to discriminate in the provision of goods, services or facilities against people on the basis that they have, or may have, a disability.

Specifically, Sections 23(1)(a) and (c) of the DDA render it unlawful to discriminate against a person by refusing to allow that person access, or the use of, any premises that the public is entitled to enter or use.

#### 3. BARRIERS TO ACCESS

The entry stairs to the premises represent a barrier to access for people who use wheelchairs. The existing sanitary facilities also are not accessible in terms of the requirements of AS 1428.1 - Design for access and mobility Part 1: General requirements for access – New building work.

#### 4. ACTION PROPOSED TO ELIMINATE THE BARRIERS TO ACCESS

It is proposed to prevail upon the landlord of the premises to install an inclined platform lift within the present stairway. This inclined platform lift will, upon installation, enable people with mobility impairments to independently enter the premises.

It is also proposed to prevail upon the landlord of the premises to provide sanitary facilities to at least the standard required by AS 1428.1.

The proposed timeframe is to have this work undertaken is within 5 years.

## 5. **EVALUATION**

This Action Plan will be reviewed after five years to assess its success.
