Question	Quick answer
What is racial discrimination?	Treating one person differently to another because of their race, colour, ethnic origin or nationality.
What is the Racial Discrimination Act (RDA)?	A law that protects the rights of people in Australia.
Why is the RDA important in our society?	So that all people can enjoy and participate in society equally.
How does the RDA work?	People who have been treated unfairly can make a complaint to the Australian Human Rights Commission.
How does the RDA relate to me?	<ul><li>affects the way you treat others</li><li>affects the way other people treat you</li></ul>
When did the RDA begin?	1975
Where did the RDA come from?	International Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Racial Discrimination
Who has used it?	Individuals and communities who have been discriminated against under the law. See landmark cases
Who has benefited from it?	Any Australian who has been treated unequally before the law.  All Australian people benefit from laws that promote equality.
